Local Broadband Plan

Shropshire Council's cabinet has agreed to adopt the revised Local Broadband Plan for 2016-2020. The Plan sets out the approach for improving broadband speeds across the Shropshire Council area. The Plan emphasises that Shropshire Council remains committed to pursuing its broadband aspiration of providing all premises with access to superfast broadband by 2020. “Mole” helps make light work of Connecting Shropshire as fibre broadband roll-out “ploughs” on

Is it a digger? Is it a crane? No, it's a mole plough!.....

This may be an increasingly common sight this summer as the Connecting Shropshire roll-out of faster fibre broadband continues to extend to some of the more remote parts of the county.

Using a mole plough allows fibre optic cable to be laid more easily and quickly, minimising disruption to motorists using the county's narrow, rural lanes.

The specialist machinery - seen here at work in south Shropshire - creates a channel through the soil just big enough to enable engineers to lay the ducting, through which the fibre optic cable to be pulled through later.



Steve Charmley, Shropshire Council Cabinet member responsible for broadband, said: “Mole ploughing is one of the ways that we're taking fibre broadband to the most hard-to-reach parts of Shropshire. The Council remains committed to pursuing its broadband aspiration of providing all premises with access to superfast broadband by 2020. Access to faster broadband will help to drive Shropshire's economy and remains a top priority for the Council.”

Better Broadband Subsidy Scheme

As part of the government's commitment to provide every property with access to a basic broadband service of at least 2Mbps, Connecting Shropshire is operating a Better Broadband Subsidy Scheme (funded by Broadband Delivery UK). The Scheme provides support towards the cost of the installation of a broadband connection so that a basic broadband service can be purchased for a first year cost of no more than £400 (taking account of any up-front costs and the 12 month service charges).

You will only be eligible if your premises has access to download speeds of less than 2Mbps. Further details about the Scheme can be found at:
