BRAIN TEASER

Can you win eight tricks for the N/S partnership?


You are player S. W begins the game by laying down ♥7. Then N puts his cards face up on the table so everyone can see them. Apart from these, nobody can see anybody else's cards. As S, you alone choose which cards to play from both the N and S hands for the whole game. The order of play is clockwise and you, S, decide to play ♥2 from N's hand. Then, E plays the ♥J from his own hand.

Rules:

1. There are four players. E/W play as a team against the N/S pair.
2. There are no trumps. Each trick is won by the pair playing the highest card in the suit led. So in this example the first trick is won by whoever plays highest ♥.
3. Everyone must follow suit if they can, but each player can choose which card in a suit to play, e.g. S - who chooses for N - decides to play ♥2 from N's hand after the ♥7 had been led by W, rather than ♥A.
4. If you can't follow suit, you can play any of the cards remaining in your hand. Remember that as S, you will also play N's hand.
5. The player (N, S, E or W) who wins a trick starts the next trick. He/She can choose any card they want from their hand. For example, if you (S) choose to win the first trick with ♥K by overtaking E's ♥J, then you choose any of the remaining cards left in S's hand to start the second trick. If you ever win a trick from N's hand then you must start the next round from N's hand.

Oh, yes: and the other rule is you must assume that everyone plays to the best of their ability, so your opponents (E/W) won't throw away their best cards to make it easy for you! If you get stuck, see below for the answer.

♠ J 6 3
♥ A 2
♦ A 9 6 5
♣ Q J 10 6



♠ A K 7 2
♥ K 6
♦ Q J 10 7
♣ K 9 2

The brain teaser is a bridge hand but you don't need any previous knowledge of bridge to solve it.

Bridge is a mind game played as a partnership. It helps to develop communication skills, improve memory and reasoning, and promotes social interaction. In other words, it helps to do for the brain what physical exercise does for the body.

Statistically, a weird card distribution is always unlikely so assume that this game is no exception. Your weakest suit is clearly ♠ and E/W will exploit this if they can. Your best bet is to take the first trick with ♠K, then lead clubs – and if necessary keep leading them – until E or W play their ♣A. This strategy will leave you with the top cards in all suits, better enabling you to control the rest of the game and ensure eight tricks. With a fair wind

Answer:

THE VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR

... is there for everyone. Anyone can use it

1. You only need a defibrillator if **breathing stops** and the patient is unresponsive, i.e. they look dead and when you shake them and shout at them they don't respond
2. The very first thing to do is to **RING 999**. You **HAVE** to do this before anything else.
Make sure you have the **exact location** of the patient ready
3. Ask for **AMBULANCE**
4. Don't rush into yelling everything at the Controller
Listen to the questions and answer them
The questions are in a specific order for the Controller to gather vital information and despatch the ambulance immediately to the right location
This is the moment the CFR will be activated if they are on call and nearby
5. The first question will be "Is the patient breathing?"
When you answer "No" the controller will give you the **combination code for the defibrillator box**
6. That's when **someone is sent for the defibrillator**
Write down the code to take with you/them
7. Make sure the **doors** where the patient is are **unlocked**, and at night all the **lights are on**, so the ambulance crew can get in
8. **IT IS VITALLY IMPORTANT TO START CPR AS SOON AS POSSIBLE ...**
... even before ringing 999 if there is more than one person with you, and all the time someone is collecting the defibrillator
The ambulance service Controller will talk you through how to do this and won't hang up
If possible put your phone on Loudspeaker and keep it nearby while you do what the Controller tells you
9. When the defibrillator arrives **DON'T STOP CPR**
Open the defibrillator case and switch the machine on
The defibrillator will take a few moments to get going but then **it will tell you what to do** and keep telling you until you have done it. **LISTEN CAREFULLY**
The defibrillator may or may not advise a shock or shocks but it will tell you exactly how to do this
Don't stop CPR until the defibrillator tells you to, which it will every now and again
Restart CPR when it tells you to
10. The CFR and/or ambulance is on its way
Keep going with the CPR until the CFR or ambulance crew tells you to stop


Pirates of the Curry Bean

It allows users to create user generated games and share them with their friends in a virtual massively multiplayer world.

As the game is designed to centre around user generated content, some inappropriate content may be shared with the community.

It also has social elements built into that allow both public and private chats. This has created some reported instances of this app being used by some adults to make inappropriate contact with children.



Dervish

Great news for fans of Irish music. One of the best-known bands in the world of Irish music, Dervish, are playing at Black Park, Halton on Tuesday 3rd October, 8pm.

Dave Andrews of Offa Events, who are organising the concert, said 'Dervish's agent contacted me out of the blue. They're such

a huge name I just couldn't turn down the opportunity to put them on. It's another big moment for us. Dervish have played all over the world and don't tour in Britain very often. They're only here for one week so we've been very lucky to get them.'

Offa Events is run by Dave and his wife Jane Trudgill who live on the Wern by Weston Rhyn. Together they have organised over one hundred concerts during the last fifteen years, many of them at the Cross Keys in Selattyn and the Last Inn in Hengoed, and have specialised in attracting big names to the area. Other big name Irish bands have included Altan and Lunasa. With a focus on artists from the Celtic nations they have also hosted internationally-renowned musicians such as Aly Bain and Phil Cunningham from Scotland.

'Black Park is a new venue for us,' continued Dave. 'It's ideal in many ways. There's an excellent sound system, raked seating, a bar and a large car park. Also it's less than a minute from the A5/A483, no distance from MacDonald's on the Chirk by-pass.'


