Moreton Hall's Year 8 artist Lucy Nelson has won Oswestry Youth Music Festival's annual competition to design the 2020 festival logo. Lucy's entry was selected amongst 80 designs from entries across Shropshire.

Lucy's design will feature on the cover of the event programme and over 1000 musicians participating in 81 different classes including; instrumental, vocal, orchestral and choral between Wednesday 26th February to Sunday 1st March will be presented with a sticker incorporating her design.

Lucy was presented with a gift voucher by Councillor Peter Cherrington who commented "The judges were unanimous in their decision of awarding Lucy first place. Her design is very modern and trendy and exactly what the judges were looking for".

The Oswestry Youth Music Festival 2020 is an important event in the Oswestry Town Council's calendar and has been held annually for over 40 years.

Each year approximately 1000 young musicians are welcomed to the town to participate. Each class is presented with a trophy for the winner, and there are certificates and mark sheets for every performer. Cash prizes of £100 are awarded for the overall winners of the 12 and under, and 15 and under categories and £200 for the overall winner of the 21 and under category.

Music is a performing art, and the Festival provides an excellent opportunity to perform in front of a friendly, supportive audience. Constructive feedback is provided by the adjudicators for every performer. The Finals classes will be held on Sunday 1st March in Christchurch. A new trophy for the Organ Class, courtesy of the Courtyard Venue will be presented this year and the festival will be reviving the Rock Bands Class.

Student BioScience Essay Success

The world faces many challenges in the 21st Century; from disease and drug resistance to species extinctions and climate change. Many of these challenges are biological, so can biology save the world? The University of Gloucestershire set this as a challenge in their A Level essay competition last term and we were delighted to learn this week that Sixth Form student, Isobel Jones, has been awarded the Runner Up Prize.

Head of Biology, Mrs Peel, commented: "Isobel's excellent essay on the use of Brain Computer Interface technology (BCI) has won her £500.

"Moreton's Sixth Form Biology students entered essays in the competition and we had some other very high quality entries. Moreton Hall also won £500 as the school who submitted the most entries and all of the girls who took part will receive a certificate in recognition of their entry."

Reflecting on her success, Isobel added: "My article was about brain-computer interface technology and how in the future, the human brain working alongside computers and AI software could lead to new and effective solutions for the problems we're facing.

"I was inspired by all the buzz around AI at the moment, all the advancements being made with it, and how it looks like it will become a really useful tool in so many areas. I am also a really big Elon Musk fan, and was really interested by the plans his company Neuralink has to develop brain-computer interface tech.

"It's amazing that the Biology department gives us these opportunities to explore and engage in our subjects outside the classroom, especially when you get to talk about, and research a subject you are so interested in, and I am really grateful to Mrs Peel for encouraging us to enter the competition.

"I am really happy and surprised that I managed to be a runner-up; I genuinely didn't think this would happen."

The University of Gloucester's judging panel added: "The standard of writing and the depth of understanding were outstanding. "Your students' essays were excellent, and demonstrated their passion for Biology. The judges ranked Isobel's essay as runner up, and noted that her essay was highly commended to reward her efforts."

Shoulder Pain

Shoulder pain can be caused by a number of factors, including acute injury during a sporting activity, an ageing body, or commonly habitual postural changes, e.g. sitting hunched over a laptop.


When shoulders move into a more rounded position, the chest muscles shorten and the upper back muscles weaken & lengthen. Scapula movement might be restricted, and the gap for tendons to travel through might narrow. In turn the rotator cuff muscles, which can no longer work in a balanced fashion, often end up being impinged, getting strained or tendonitis. A good holistic treatment (e.g. osteopathy) will usually start with working to reduce pain and improving the range of movement (of the shoulder and spine). Advice is given on self-help to aid recovery, such as how to support the arm when painful without causing further issues. Additionally, there will be advice on what activities to temporarily avoid e.g. push-ups and bench presses, swimming front crawl during desk posture etc, in order to speed recovery. During the recovery there needs to be some re-education on desk posture, workstation set-up, use of laptops and driving posture.

Once the shoulder has full range of motion again and there is no pain, exercises can be prescribed to strengthen the back muscles between the shoulder blades and the spine and stretching out the muscles on the front of the chest so that the shoulders can be held in a better position in order to avoid recurrence.

First Time Central Heating Grants

Funding is available to install **free first-time central heating** to vulnerable and low-income households across Shropshire. This includes households who have an existing gas connection but no central heating or where a property can be connected to the gas network for the first time. Central heating installs should be fully funded for qualifying residents and are available to tenants as well as those that own their own home.

Data provided from the Gas Network operator Wales and West has identified more than 500 households are close enough to the existing gas network to be connected. This includes some in parts of Oswestry, Gobowen, Weston Rhyn and St Martins.

Oliver Rothwell, project Manager at Keep Shropshire Warm said

“We would encourage anyone who is interested to contact our team today, whether for themselves or on behalf of a relative or friend. Funding like this doesn’t come around very often, so we’re keen to help as many people as we can”.

Applications are currently being accepted through the Council’s Keep Shropshire Warm energy advice service – which is managed by Shrewsbury based charity Marches Energy Agency.




