

#### Report from St Martins Parish Council Clerk

After the elections in May 2021 there were a number of vacancies on the Parish Council. Following the latest notice of these casual vacancies, George Smith from Firs Close has been co-opted onto the Parish Council which now brings the Parish Council up to its full strength of 15 members. Contact details for all Parish Councillors are included in this magazine.

The Parish Council have again set their precept for the parish for the year 2022/23 with a zero % increase from last year. In fact it is now many years since the Parish Council increased their precept.

There are still a number of issues that were brought to the Parish Council last year that remain outstanding. These include:

Concern over the dangerous state of the fencing adjacent to the car park along Overton Road next to the Take-away shops, which had been reported to the landowner who is also responsible for the state of the wooden fencing surrounding the Electricity Sub Station next to these shops. In places the concrete posts and wire fencing are overhanging the footpath that is well used by children and parents walking to school. At the start of December 2021 the landowner confirmed that this would be removed ASAP. He was again reminded on the 10<sup>th</sup> January that this had still not been done.

At least 22 street lights along Overton Road and Ellesmere Road which are owned and maintained by Shropshire Council are not working, some of which have been reported over 12 months ago. Shropshire Councillor Steve Davenport is aware of this and taking this up with the street lighting department at Shropshire Council who sub-contract out these repairs.

Planning is another issue where the Parish Council have concerns. All planning applications are considered by the parish councillors, who listen to local concerns and comments and report these via the Shropshire Council planning portal. Recently, questions were raised and further clarification requested from the planning officer dealing with a relevant application, only for the Parish Council to be advised by the Assistant Director of Economy and Place at Shropshire Council that officers in planning services do not normally go back to all the consultees and third party representatives who send in comments, as they do not have the capacity due to the volume of comments received overall. We have advised them that in this one case we were asking for clarification on a number of concerns, not making comments, before submitting our response.

Another area of concern is the reporting of highway issues. These are reported via the Shropshire Council 'My Shropshire' reporting system. Although a reference number is sent back within 24 hours these reports then sit in the system. At present we have 8 outstanding reports dating back to January 2021 which include dog fouling, overgrown hedges and shrubs over footpaths, sunken roadside manhole covers, pot holes and a request for dropped kerbs on either side of the bridge at Escob, along Overton Road at its junction with New Ifton, as well as readjustments by the Memorial Garden adjacent to Green Lane and access to the crossing.

The Parish Council would like to stress that any concerns that the public have, whether these are police issues, highway issues or street lighting issues, and reported to either a Parish Councillor, the Parish Clerk or at a Parish Council meeting, are reported to the relevant authorities responsible for these services. As you can see from the above reports, the lack of response we receive is very disappointing however we will continue to monitor these and continue to express our concerns over the lack of progress and responses.


#### St Martins Christmas Tree





- The land at the western side of the current School playing field will most likely be used to form an earth barrier (or bund) between the School and the adjacent Bank Top Industrial Estate,
- The remainder of the current School playing field will continue to be available for grass based sports activities
- St Martins Recreation Partnership wish to generate more detailed ideas for facilities on both existing and new land areas as a follow up to the earlier Parish Council surveys.
- This is an exciting opportunity for our community but we need your input if we are to get it right

#### **Lapwing and Curlew**

If you enjoy seeing Lapwing and Curlew, and would like to do something to help stop their disappearance from the local countryside, we would like your help, please.



We need to know how many breeding pairs there are, and where, before we can try and help them. We looked for them up until 2019, in an area roughly bounded by Oswestry in the south, the border with Wales to the west and north, and Duddleston Heath and Lower Frankton in the east (the three parishes of Weston Rhyn, St Martin's and Gobowen, plus an area to the east, towards Ellesmere). We found three pairs of Curlew, and about 30 pairs of Lapwing. Our work was disrupted by Covid-19 in the last two years, but

we are starting again this coming Spring.

People who have helped previously will be asked to help again, but new helpers will be very welcome, please.

Participants take on a survey square of 2x2 kilometres and visit it three times, using lanes and public footpaths. You choose the dates, to suit you, around 1st April, 1st May

and 15th June. Each visit takes less than half a day, so it doesn't take much time. It's easy to do, and participants are provided with simple survey instructions and a map to record sightings on. If possible, we'd also like you to record Kestrel, Cuckoo, and other target species, but that's an optional extra.

A meeting is planned for 7.30pm on Thursday 17 March, at St Martins Village Centre, Overton Road, SY11 3AY (next.to Stans Supermarket), to describe these birds and where we've found them previously, explain what's involved to new participants, and launch the 2022 survey. If it can't



be held, or new helpers can't attend, they will be briefed by email. There will be a practical (socially-distanced) training session, explaining how to go about the survey, and record what you see, around the end of March, if you feel you need it. If you definitely want to help, please let us know before the meeting.
